Bringing Our Community Together This Season

THANKSGIVING

INCA began the holiday season by sharing Thanksgiving Baskets with families in Atoka and Murray Counties. Thanks to the generosity of our community, donations were collected and turned into full Thanksgiving meals, with 150 Thanksgiving Baskets distributed in Atoka County and 150 in Murray County. These efforts helped ensure that local individuals and families could gather, celebrate, and enjoy a meaningful holiday together.



RSVP helped spread Thanksgiving cheer by providing holiday turkeys to families in need across our communities. In Johnston County, 50 turkeys were distributed, with an additional 31 turkeys given to families in Marshall County. These donations helped support families across both counties during the Thanksgiving holiday.

Community partners across the counties came together to support this effort. The process began with sharing the need through social media and reaching out to past donors, which led to an outpouring of generous donations. Once funds were secured, staff worked quickly to shop for food items and assemble the Thanksgiving baskets. This year, more than \$15,000 was raised and shared between INCA and community partners to ensure families had enough food to prepare a Thanksgiving meal for their loved ones at home.

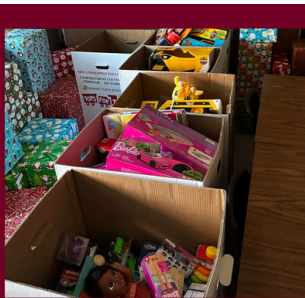

The community's support was truly overwhelming. Through generous donations and partnerships, 1,098 toys, 367 books, and 1,098 stocking stuffers were made available to support 366 children from 133 families during these events.

Hosted by Atoka EMS, this community-centered event brought together families, first responders, and local supporters to help fill an ambulance with donated items for those in need. MURRAY

Murray County hosted a Polar Express-themed holiday party complete with a train, creating a magical experience for local children and families. Kids enjoyed train rides along with a variety of fun activities, including ornament decorating, face painting, a petting zoo, and even a smash car. This year, local businesses truly showed up in a big way by raising funds to support children in Murray County, and their efforts were warmly embraced and well received by the community.



From October 1, 2025 through December 12, 2025, a total of \$8,969.00 was raised to support the Toys for Tots effort. During this time, 457 toys, 200 books, 134 stocking stuffers, and 30 additional gifts were distributed, serving 355 children across 136 families. This initiative was made possible by the dedication of 30 volunteers who helped with gift wrapping, setup, and teardown. In addition, 17 local businesses served as drop-off locations for Toys for Tots donation boxes, while 27 businesses generously hosted change jars, making it easy for the community to give and support local families during the holiday season.
